#### What will I do at ALIVE?

ALIVE offers a full week of fun and enriching activities including classes on cooking, art, computers, and literacy skills. In addition ALIVE teaches life skills and vocational skills in our one-on-one services that are individualized to each person's skills, wants, and needs.

ALIVE offers trips for bowling, fishing, picnics, health club activities, community exploration and much more. We meet with other programs, and ALIVE hosts an annual dance.

You will learn to speak for yourself through our self-advocacy support group meetings. You have choices and can take charge of what you want to do.

You may want to live independently or with your parents/guardians. ALIVE can assist you in finding affordable housing. You will be given the tools to live on your own and learn how to make your home safe and comfortable.
