

HOW WE WORK

The Family Empowerment Center (FEC) is a community-based service provided by PRS, a non-profit agency.

FEC offers FREE services to families of children with disabilities. Services are supported through funding from the California Department of Education. Services can be stand-alone or coordinated with Far Northern Regional Center, school districts, and other community service providers.



FEC services address preschool and school concerns and transitioning from school to adulthood.

This program also works to connect parents and families facing similar challenges to promote social interaction, engagement, and support.

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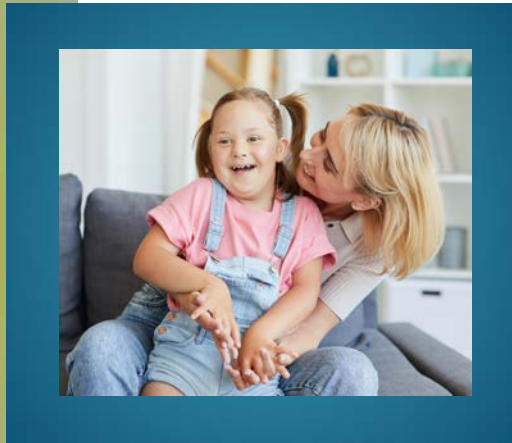

Our Family Empowerment Center offers the following:
