Visions

Youth development in Plumas County

Visions is a youth development program that helps participants build connections with themselves, their peers, women in the community, and the surrounding forests of Plumas County. Visions provides a safe space that supports 11-18 year old girls, non-binary individuals, and allies as they build capacity for self-confidence, physical and emotional resiliency, healthy relationships, community, and regular physical activity.

Visions encourages and inspires its members through building and sustaining trusting relationships; finding passion and purpose in life; establishing positive, non-violent communication techniques; creatively solving problems; cultivating leadership skills; and strengthening family, peer group, community, and environmental connections. The program aims to meet participants where they are at, resulting in a variety of afterschool and summertime activities.

"Visions gives me the support that a community can provide, rather than just myself," a 10th grade participant said.

Participants pursue strengths-based goals through facilitated group mentoring sessions, outdoor recreational activities, and dedicated bonding time. More information about this Quincy-based program can be found [online here](#).
